World Cities

- **World City:** (or global city) a city that is a control center of the global economy, in which major decisions are made about the world's commercial networks and financial markets.
- Cities became centers of trade and seats of power for colonizing nations.
- **Ex.** Paris, Singapore, Tokyo, Hong Kong, Los Angeles, Sydney, etc.

	Definition	Examples
Rank-Size Rule	A pattern of settlements in a country, such that the nth largest settlement is 1/n the population of the largest settlement. Most developed nations follow this rule unless they have a primate city.	City 1: $12/1 = 12$ million City 2: $12/2 = 6$ million City 3: $12/3 = 4$ million City 4: $12/4 = 3$ million City 5: $12/5 = 2.4$ million
Primate City	The largest settlement in a country, must have MORE than 2x the people than the second ranking city. It should be disproportionately large and a leader in national capacity and expressions. Good Examples: Paris, London, Cairo	1) London = 7,172,091 2) Birmingham = 970,892 3) Leeds = 715,404 4) Glasgow = 577,869 5) Sheffield = 512,879
