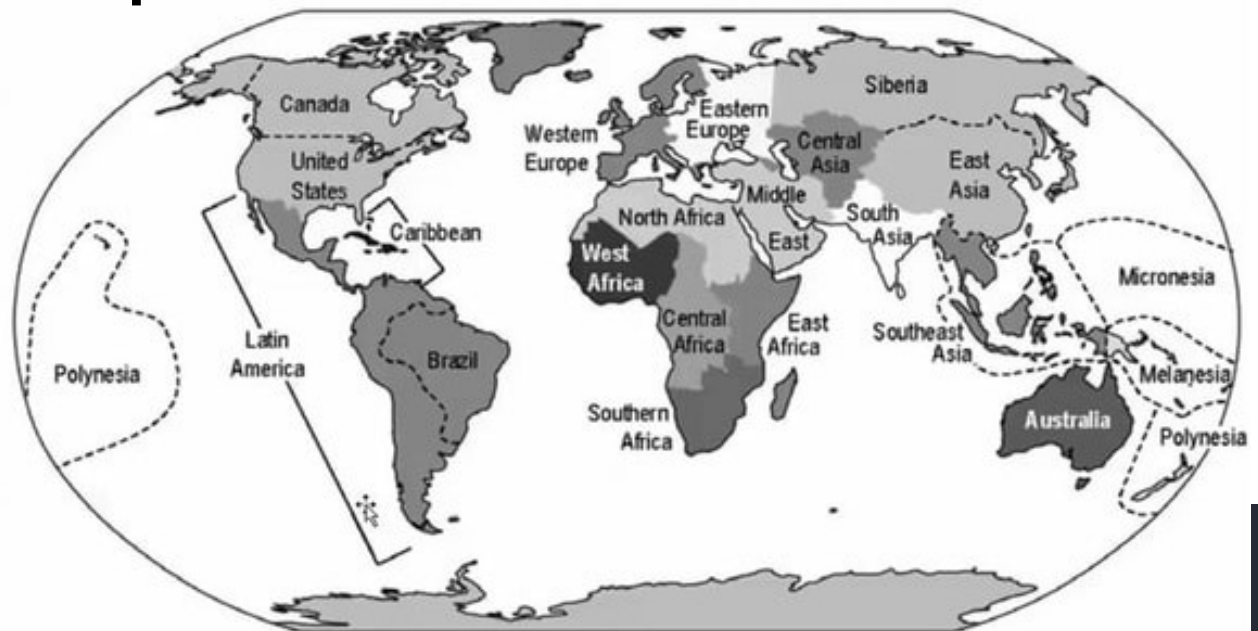

## What is a regions?

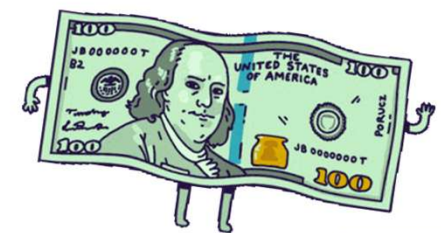
**Regions: A geographic area with common characteristics and patterns**

Vernacular**



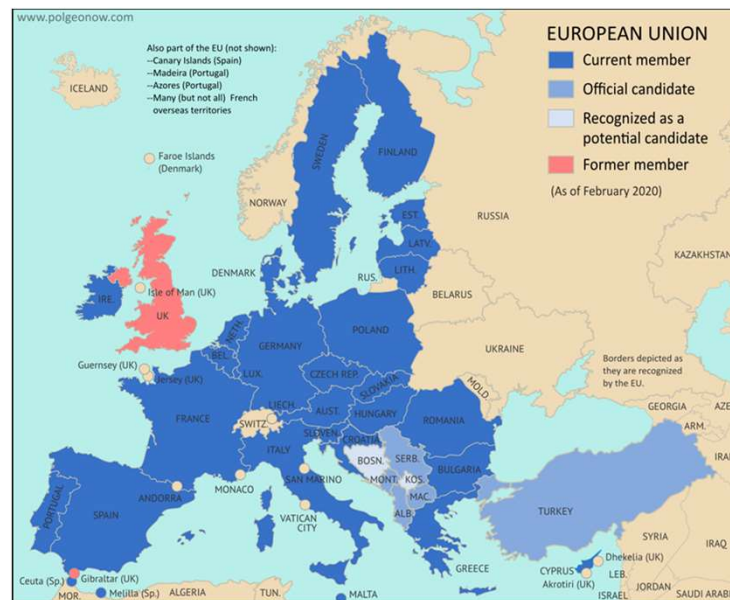
## FORMAL REGION

**Definition:** A geographic area with common attributes, traditionally defined by economic, social, political, or environmental characterizes.



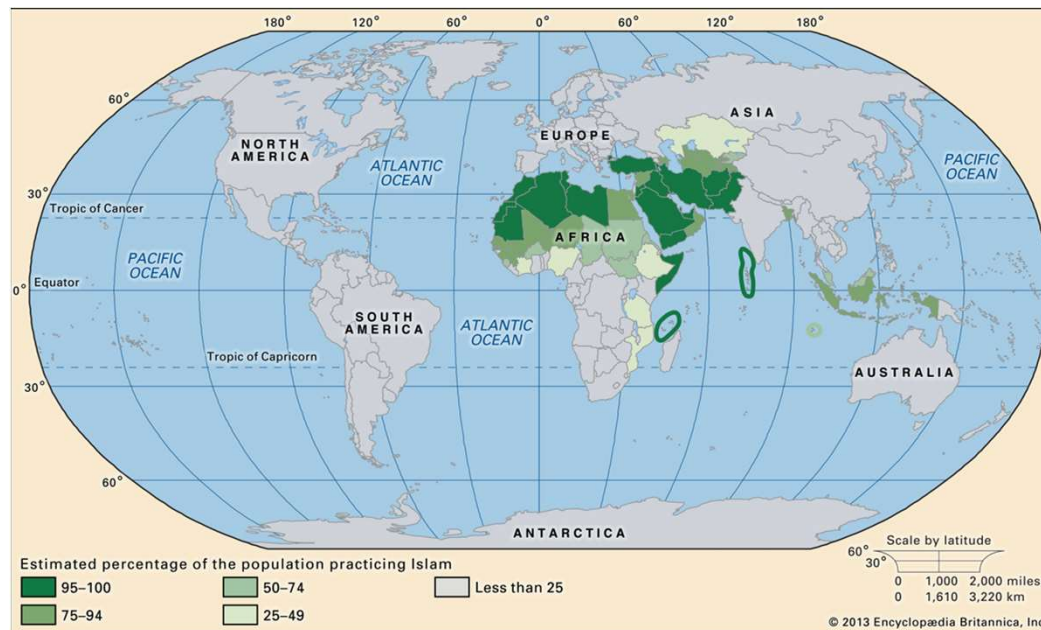
# EXAMPLE: Economic Region

European Union (EU) Free Trade. Common currency (the Euro).

Islamic World: Distribution of Muslim followers is primarily clustered in SW and C Asia and N Africa.

## EXAMPLE: Environmental

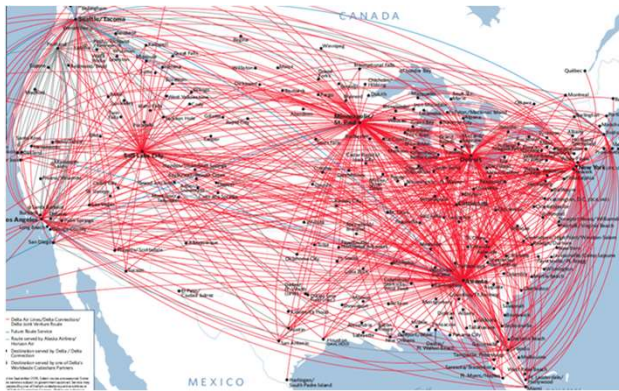
The Sahara Desert: Desert region which separates N Africa and Sub-Saharan Africa.





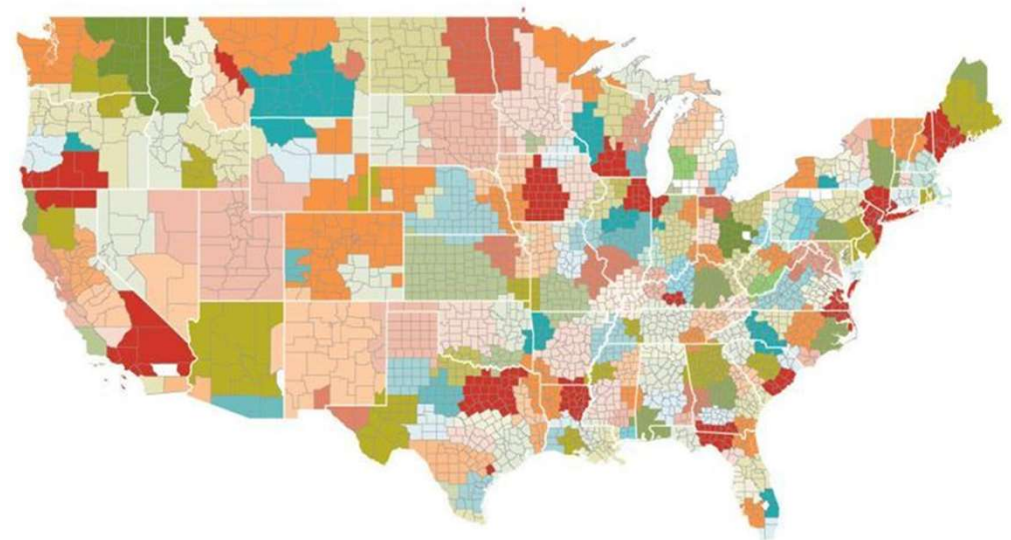
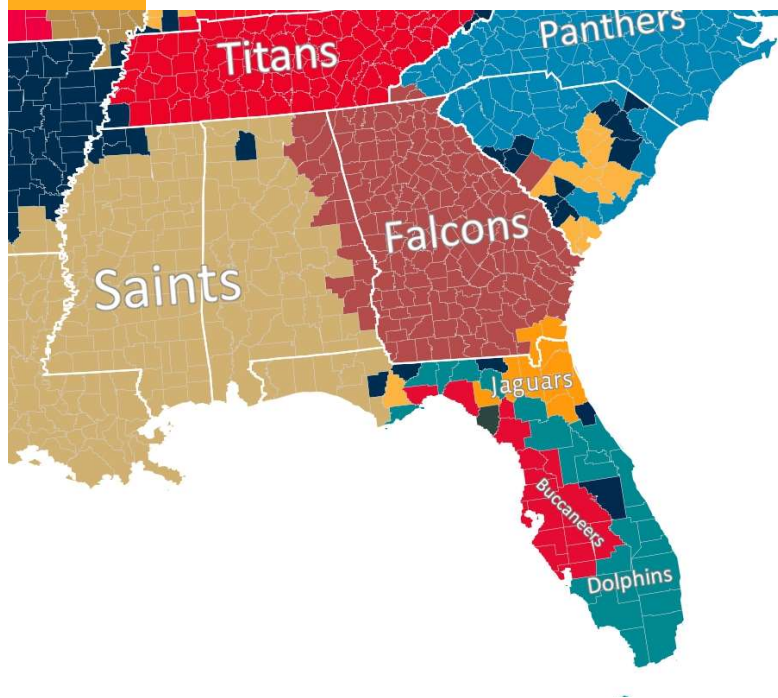
# FUNCTIONAL REGION

Definition: organized around a central node (focal point) and the relationship is typically based around economics, travel or communication.



## EXAMPLE: A functional region

Delivery zones, NFL teams, newspaper service

**Functional Region:** Television Markets - organized around a node of focal point – broadcast signal (note the outlines of the states and counties are formal regions)

## PERCEPTUAL REGION

A geographic area that has no perfect definition, it only exists because of people's beliefs, feelings, and attitudes towards a region

- Sense of place & cultural identity.
