


What are the contemporary causes of cultural diffusion?

Time-space compression/convergence: The shrinking of the world due to improvements in communication and transportation technologies.

Cultural Convergence: The process of two or more cultures coming into contact with each other and adopting each other's traits to become more alike.

- Language



Effects of Cutural Convergence

The results of time-space convergence and the widespread diffusion of popular culture are:

- Loss of indeginous languages and traditional cultures.
- Of about 5,000-6,000 languages being spoken today, only half will exist in 100 years.



What causes the extinction of languages and cultures?

- Genocide
- Pressure of globalization and cultural convergence
- Laws against the use of indigenous languages
 - For example, in Turkey the Kurds are forbidden by the government to print or formally teach their language.
 - Native American Boarding schools in the US from 1890s-1960s.

- Assimilation The process through which people lose originality differentiating traits, such as dress, speech, particularities, or mannerisms, when they come into contact with another society or culture.

Cultural Divergence

Cultural Divergence: Cultures become LESS alike due to both cultural and physical barriers. The process of a culture restricting contact with other cultures in an attempt to retain its originality.

Separating/distinguishing from mainstream.

 Amish Culture is distinctive due to isolation from mainstream US culture and a rejection of electricity and modern technologies.
