- Rural survey methods include...

#### Metes and Bounds:

- Great Britain to N. America
- Utilization of landmarks and physical features to establish boundary lines.
- Results in irregular shaped plots of land.



## **Rural Survey Methods**

- Rural survey methods include...

#### Long Lot:

- France & Spain to N. America
- Long strips of land that start at a river or lake with the intention of providing all landowners with equal access to the resources (soil & water) and transportation.



## **Rural Survey Methods**

- Defining the boundaries of land ownership.
- Rural survey methods include...
- Township and Range:
  - Pioneered by Thomas Jefferson
  - Rectangles and grid system.
  - Each township is 6 miles x 6 miles
  - Keep track of land sales and purchases, utilize a uniform survey method.



## **Rural Settlement Patterns**

Rural settlement patterns are classified as...

- Clustered: Throughout European history, rural residents lived in groups of homes in close proximity to one another.
  - Farmland and pasture surround the settlement
  - Share resources & community
  - Have to walk to farmland
  - Metes and Bounds Survey Methods



## **Rural Settlement Patterns**

Rural settlement patterns are classified as...

- Dispersed: Major characteristic is that settlements are isolated and dispersed over the land area.
  - US government promoted westward expansion by giving farmers land (usually 160 acres) if they agreed to live and farm on it.
  - Reflective of individual values and ownership of land.
  - Township & Range Survey Methods



## **Rural Settlement Patterns**

Rural settlement patterns are classified as...

- Linear: Settlement is organized along a LINE - typically associated with transportation system or physical feature like a river or coast.
  - Long Lot Survey Methods
